
Research median price heat maps. Google property heat maps + suburb, and look at the images it produces. What you're looking for is a cold patch of median prices surrounded by much hotter suburbs with higher median prices - this makes the cold patch lukewarm




Domain shows days on market – look at recent historical data for last 12 months and if it's fallen from above 100 to below 100 that's the time it's lukewarm and time to start looking
